

Migratory Bird and Wildlife benefits of Water Supply and Water Quality Bond Act of 2018

Migratory Bird benefits

Wildlife Conservation Board Waterfowl program (Section 86123)

\$120,000,000 to acquire and protect migratory bird habitat and provide water for their habitat.

\$40,000,000 for the California Waterfowl Habitat and landowner incentive programs

\$10,000,000 for the Shared Habitat Alliance for Recreational Enhancement program

\$110,000,000 for water and infrastructure to deliver it to wildlife refuges pursuant to the Central Valley Project Improvement Act.

San Francisco Bay Restoration Authority: \$200,000,000 (Section 86042).

Many of these funds will go to restoring wetlands in San Francisco Bay.

Water for Wildlife: \$300,000,000 (Section 86120)

These funds will be used to acquire water for fish and wildlife. They could be used to acquire water for waterfowl refuges.

Incentives for Fish and Wildlife Enhancement on Private Lands: \$50,000,000 (Section 86121)

Pacific Flyway Waterfowl Center. \$20,000,000 (Section 86080(u))

Salton Sea habitat. \$200,000,000 (Section 86080(o))

Programs which will benefit migratory birds and other wildlife (See separate page for fisheries and river benefits).
