

## **North Coast benefits from Water Supply and Water Quality Act**

**Marin, Sonoma, Napa, Mendocino, Humboldt, Trinity, Del Norte Counties**

### **2018 water bond initiative**

**Safe Drinking Water and Wastewater treatment for disadvantaged communities \$750 million.** The state safe drinking water plan lists nearly 50 instances of water quality violations on the North Coast<sup>1</sup>. Many of these are in small water systems which would be eligible for funds from this category.

**Wastewater recycling. \$400 million.** There are a variety of eligible projects throughout the North Coast, especially in Marin and Sonoma Counties.

**Urban water conservation. \$300 million.** Many districts on the North Coast could make use of these funds.

**Agricultural water conservation: \$50 million.** These funds could be used throughout the North Coast.

**Flood Control Reservoirs. \$100 million.** The language in this section was amended by the Sonoma County Water Agency to allow for improvements to flood control facilities at Lake Mendocino.

**Stormwater management. \$440 million.** There is a great need for these funds in Sonoma, Napa and Marin Counties, and in other counties.

**Bay Area Conservancy, administered by Coastal Conservancy. \$100 million.** These funds are important for watershed restoration and preservation in Sonoma, Napa and Marin Counties.

**Coastal Conservancy. \$135 million. Watershed restoration and protection.** Funds available to all counties except Trinity.

**River Parkways. \$70 million.** Funds available to all counties.

**Russian River Parkway. \$10 million.** Administered by the Coastal Conservancy.

**Napa River Parkway. \$10 million.** Administered by the Coastal Conservancy.

**Wildlife Habitat, Oak woodlands, agricultural partnerships, and habitat conservation plans. \$300 million.** Available to all counties.

**State Parks watershed restoration and water facilities. \$150 million.** Available to state parks in all counties.

**Resource conservation districts, agricultural land protection \$60 million.** Available in all counties.

**Ocean Protection. \$100 million.** Available to all coastal counties.

**Urban Streams. \$50 million.** Available in all counties.

**Urban Forestry. \$20 million.** Available in all counties.

**Non-motorized river and lake access. \$20 million.** Available in all counties.

**CalFire fire mitigation and restoration: \$50 million.** Available in all counties.

**Land management and weed control for water supply. Wildlife Conservation Board. \$100 million.** Available in all counties.

**State and local conservation Corps. \$40 million.** Available to North Bay Conservation Corps.

**Watershed restoration to benefit fisheries. \$393 million.** Available in all counties.

**Sustainable Groundwater Management Act implementation: \$640 million.** Available in all counties.

**Water supply and habitat restoration for fish, wildlife and waterfowl: \$930 million.** Available in all counties.

**North Bay Aqueduct relocation planning. \$5 million.** Of benefit to Napa County.

**Oroville dam repair. \$200 million.** Of benefit to Napa County.
