## Benefits of Water Supply and Clean Water Initiative for Sacramento County

Wastewater recycling: \$400 million. Any agency in Sacramento County can apply for these funds.

**Urban water conservation: \$300 million.** Any agency in Sacramento County can apply for these funds.

Central Valley Flood Board: \$150 million. These funds can go to implementing the Central Valley floodplan in

Sacramento County.

Sacramento State University: \$5 million. For water research.

Stormwater management: \$400 million. Any agency in Sacramento County can apply for these funds.

**Delta Conservancy: \$100 million.** Sacramento County is represented on the Delta Conservancy.

American River Parkway: \$30 million.

**Wildlife Conservation Board: \$300 million.** Includes funds for oak woodlands, habitat conservation plans, farmland conservation and other programs important in Sacramento County.

**State parks: \$150 million.** All the many State Park units are eligible for these funds.

**Resource Conservation Districts and agricultural lands: \$60 million.** All Sacramento County RCDs are eligible for these funds, as are agricultural land conservation programs.

**Urban Streams: \$50 million.** Any agency in Sacramento County can apply for these funds.

**Urban Forestry: \$20 million.** Any agency in Sacramento County can apply for these funds.

**Delta Wastewater treatment: \$15 million** Legacy Delta towns in Sacramento County are eligible for these funds.

**Non-motorized river and lake access: \$20 million.** These funds could be used in a wide variety of locations in Sacramento County.

**Landscape conservation: \$100 million.** These funds are largely aimed at controlling invasive weeds that use water. A wide variety of areas in Sacramento County would be eligible.

**Conservation Corps: \$40 million.** The California Conservation Corps and the Sacramento Regional Conservation Corps would be eligible for these funds.

Fisheries restoration: \$1050 million. Many projects in Sacramento County would be eligible for funding.

Waterfowl habitat restoration: \$280 million. Many projects in Sacramento County would be eligible for funding.

American River Basin Planning: \$10 million. Projects approved by the Water Forum and Regional Water Authority.
